- He makes payments to his ex-wife for the upkeep of their children.

Example Bank:

- My ex-husband pays a mere £163 a month towards the upkeep of our son.
- Our taxes help pay for the upkeep of the city's parks.
- The local council is responsible for the upkeep of roads.
- The money will go towards/toward the upkeep of the centre.
- The pond requires minimal upkeep.
- The university has responsibility for the upkeep of the buildings.
- the maintenance and upkeep of the monuments
- Tenants are responsible for the upkeep of the property.
- The council's contribution towards the upkeep of the churchyard is to be withdrawn.
