late Middle English: from Latin **gentilis** ‘of a family or nation, of the same clan’ (used in the Vulgate, Latin version of the Bible prepared in the late 4th century, to refer to non-Jews), from **gens**, **gent-** ‘family, race’, from the root of **gignere** ‘beget’.
