not anyone; no person

- No one was at home.
- There was no one else around.
- We were told to speak to no one. **No one** is much more common than **nobody** in written English.

not anyone SYN nobody:

- No one likes being criticized.
- There's no one else I really want to invite apart from you.
- Has no one phoned about the car?
- No one can say I didn't warn you.

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**GRAMMAR****no one, nobody**Do not use another negative word (eg 'not') with **no one** and **nobody**:

- Nobody could hear me (NOT Nobody could not hear me).
- No one did anything about the problem (NOT No one did nothing ...).

Do not use 'of' after **no one** and **nobody**. Use **none of** or, if you are talking about two people, **neither of**:

- None of them saw him.
- Neither of his parents had come to the wedding.
