1. ~ **sth/itself (as sth)** (*formal*) to form an organization or a group again in a different way
 - The group reconstituted itself as a political party.
2. **usually passive** ~ **sth** to bring dried food, etc. back to its original form by adding water
 - reconstituted orange juice
