- **I. ir-ri-tant** [irritant irritants] *BrE* [ˈɪrɪtənt] <sup>ˈ</sup> *NAmE* [ˈɪrɪtənt] <sup>ˈ</sup> **noun**
  1. (technical) a substance that makes part of your body sore
    - chemical irritants
  2. something that makes you annoyed or causes trouble
    - The presence of the army has been a constant irritant.
- **II. ir-ri-tant** adjective usually before noun
  - irritant substances
