Word Origin:[**acne**] mid 19th cent.: via modern Latin from Greek **aknas**, a misreading of **akmas**, accusative plural of **akmē** 'highest point, peak, or facial eruption'; compare with ↑**acme**.Example Bank:

- A lot of teenagers develop acne.
- Acne often clears up by itself.
- Acne often clears up with a change in diet.
- Doctors can treat acne with creams.
- He had terrible acne when he was younger.
