Word Origin:

late 19th cent.: from Latin **signatorius** 'of sealing', from **signat-** 'marked (with a cross)', from the verb **signare**.

Example Bank:

- The Convention requires signatories to punish genocide when it occurs.
- The document must be signed by an authorized signatory of the company.
- The public letter and list of signatories can be read here.
- The signatories included Spain, Italy and Portugal.
