a gate at the entrance to a public building, ↑**stadium**, etc. that turns in a circle when pushed, allowing one person to go through at a time

Example Bank:

- My bag got hooked as I was going through the turnstile.
- Stewards were checking people's membership cards at the turnstiles.
- The club need to attract more supporters through the turnstiles.
- Fans were already lining up at the turnstiles.
