[**peremptory**] late Middle English (as a legal term): via Anglo-Norman French from Latin **peremptorius** 'deadly, decisive', from **perempt-** 'destroyed, cut off', from the verb **perimere**, from **per-** 'completely' + **emere** 'take, buy'.
