Word Origin:

late Middle English (denoting a bag for provisions): probably via Anglo-Norman French from a Germanic word related to the noun ↑well. The current sense (originally US) dates from the mid 19th cent.

Example Bank:

- He carried a photo of his children in his wallet.
- He pulled a €50 note out of his fat wallet.
- a wallet containing more than £100
- a wallet stuffed with fifty-dollar bills
- a wallet containing credit cards
