'so-called **AW** [so-called] *BrE* ^ˈ *NAmE* ^ˈ **adjective**

1. **only before noun** used to show that you do not think that the word or phrase that is being used to describe sb/sth is appropriate
 - the opinion of a so-called 'expert'
 - How have these so-called improvements helped the local community?
2. **usually before noun** used to introduce the word that people usually use to describe sth
 - artists from the so-called 'School of London'

'so-called **W3** *BrE* ^ˈ *AmE* ^ˈ **adjective** [only before noun]

1. used to describe someone or something that has been given a name that you think is wrong:
 - ˈ The so-called experts couldn't tell us what was wrong.
2. used to show that something or someone is usually called a particular name:
 - ˈ the health threats posed by so-called 'mad cow disease'
