1. **guidelines plural** rules or instructions that are given by an official organization telling you how to do sth, especially sth difficult
  - The government has **drawn up guidelines** on the treatment of the mentally ill.
2. **countable** something that can be used to help you make a decision or form an opinion
  - The figures are a useful guideline when buying a house.
