- make a diagnosis** Don't take any medicines before a doctor has made a proper diagnosis.
- give (somebody) a diagnosis** They'll be able to give me a diagnosis when they get the results of the tests.
- establish/reach a diagnosis** It is important to establish the diagnosis and begin treatment quickly.
- confirm a diagnosis** The clinic confirmed the diagnosis.

adjectives

- an early diagnosis** (=at an early stage of a disease) Early diagnosis gives patients the best chance of recovery.
- a medical diagnosis** (=given by a doctor) The company manufactures monitoring equipment for medical diagnosis.
- a clinical diagnosis** (=given as the result of tests) Pneumonia was the most common clinical diagnosis with these symptoms.
- a correct/accurate diagnosis** It is impossible to make an accurate diagnosis without an examination.
- an incorrect/wrong diagnosis** The doctors apparently made an incorrect diagnosis.
- a positive diagnosis** (=saying that a disease is present) Following a positive diagnosis, you will be admitted for hospital treatment.
