

pick-up'pick-up *BrE* ^u *AmE* ^u *noun*

1. **VEHICLE** [countable] *especially American English* a small truck with low sides that is used for carrying goods
2. **IMPROVEMENT** [countable] an improvement in something which will be good for economic success

^u There are signs of a pick-up in high street spending.

3. **COLLECTION** [uncountable and countable] an occasion when someone or something is collected from a place:

^u The price includes travel from your local pick-up point in the UK to your hotel in Paris.

^u trash pick-up

4. **PERSON** [countable] *informal* a stranger that you meet in a bar, at a party etc and have sex with
5. **MUSIC** [countable] an electronic part on a musical instrument, especially an electric ^uguitar, that makes the sound louder
6. **SPEED** [uncountable] *American English* the rate at which a vehicle can increase its speed **SYN acceleration** :
^u It was a small car, but it had good pick-up.
