

  - She cleaned a small segment of the painting.
  - Lines divided the area into segments.
2. one of the sections of an orange, a lemon, etc.

4. (*phonetics*) the smallest speech sound that a word can be divided into

### Word Origin:

late 16th cent. (as a term in geometry): from Latin *segmentum*, from *secare* 'to cut'. The verb dates from the mid 19th cent.

### Example Bank:

- The changes will affect only a small segment of the population.
- They divided the bone into equal segments.

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
