Derived Word ↑serially

adjective

1. **usually before noun** (*technical*) arranged in a series
 - tasks carried out in the same serial order
2. **only before noun** doing the same thing in the same way several times
 - a serial rapist
3. **only before noun** (*of a story, etc.*) broadcast or published in several separate parts
 - a novel in serial form

Word Origin:

mid 19th cent.: from ↑series + ↑-al, perhaps suggested by French *sérial*.

Example Bank:

- He is wanted for serial murder.
- Individual engines differ only in their serial numbers.
- Police are searching for a serial rapist who escaped from prison yesterday.
- She was the ninth victim of a serial killer.
- Such people can be described as serial monogamists.
- The computer will carry out the tasks in serial order.
- The novel was first published in serial form.
