<div>Word Origin:</div> <div>Middle English (especially representing the title given to the head of the Roman Empire): from Old French <i>emperere</i>, from Latin <i>imperator</i> ‘military commander’ , from <i>imperare</i> ‘to command’ , from <i>in-</i> ‘towards’ + <i>parare</i> ‘prepare , contrive’ .</div> <div>Example Bank:</div> <div> <div>• It was under the emperor Justinian that these advances were made.</div> <div>• during the reign of the last emperor</div> <div>• the emperor of Japan</div> <div>• It is the tomb of the first real emperor of China, Emperor Qin Shi Huang.</div> </div>

King Harald V of Norway</div> <div>▪ <b>queen</b> a woman who rules a country because she is from a royal family, or the wife of a king: She became queen when she was only 14 years old.   Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom</div> <div>▪ <b>monarch</b> a king or queen: The bishops were appointed by the monarch.</div> <div>▪ <b>monarchy</b> a country that is ruled by a king or queen, or this type of political system: Britain is a constitutional monarchy.   Some people want the monarchy to be abolished.</div> <div>▪ <b>prince</b> the son of a king, queen, or prince, or the male ruler of a small country or state: Prince Rainier of Monaco   The prince will inherit the throne when his father dies.</div> <div>▪ <b>ruler</b> someone such as a king, who has official power over a country and its people: the ruler of Babylonia   General Musharraf was the former military ruler of Pakistan.</div> <div>▪ <b>emperor</b> the ruler of an ↑empire (=group of countries): the Habsburg emperors of the 19th century   Emperor Hirohito</div> <div>▪ <b>sovereign</b> <i>formal</i> a king or queen: It was hoped that a meeting of the two sovereigns would ease tensions between the countries.</div> <div>▪ <b>regent</b> someone who governs instead of a king or queen, because the king or queen is ill, absent, or still a child: Edward II left his friend Gaveston as regent.</div> <div>▪ <b>the crown</b> <i>formal</i> the position of king or queen: Warwick was a loyal servant of the crown.</div> </div>	<div>Longman DOCE 5th Ed.
