- stationary target - неподвижная цель

- to remain stationary - оставаться неподвижным

2) закреплённый, стационарный

- stationary crane [engine, transformer] - стационарный кран [двигатель, трансформатор]
- stationary population - *спец.* стационарное население

2. постоянный, неизменный, стационарный, стабильный

- stationary temperature - постоянная /устойчивая/ температура
- stationary vibration - *физ.* установившиеся колебания
- stationary motion - *физ.* установившееся движение
- a stationary period in science - период зстоя в науке
- no form of living speech can be stationary - никакая форма живой речи не может оставаться неизменной

3. 1) не меняющий местонахождения

- stationary dive - погружение без хода (*о подводной лодке*)
- stationary waves - *физ.* стоячие волны
- stationary hospital - стационарный госпиталь

2) не меняющий местожительства

I've been stationary at N. for the last fifteen years - я не уезжал из N. /постоянно живу в N. / последние пятнадцать лет

[**stationary**] late Middle English: from Latin **stationarius** (originally in the sense 'belonging to a military station'), from **statio(n-)** 'standing', from **stare** 'to stand'.

- I walked down one of the stationary escalators.
- Some of the larger birds can remain stationary in the air for several minutes.

▶ Do not confuse with the noun **stationery** (=writing materials such as paper).

THESAURUS

■ **not moving**

- **still** not moving – use this especially about people who are not moving, or about places where there is no wind: There was no wind and the trees were completely still. | Keep still while I tie your shoes.
- **stationary** not moving – use this about cars, trains, or objects: The truck swerved and hit a stationary vehicle.
- **immobile** not moving or not able to move, especially because of fear or tiredness: As the disease progressed, she became increasingly immobile.
- **motionless** completely still – used especially in literature: Kemp sat motionless as the verdict was read.
- **calm** not moving because there is no wind – use this about air and water: The lake was calm.
- **be at a standstill** if traffic is at a standstill it is not moving: Traffic was at a standstill on the motorway.
