 2. **uncountable, countable** a thick slice of any type of meat
 - pork steak
 - a gammon steak
 3. **uncountable** (often in compounds) beef that is not of the best quality, often sold in small pieces and used in ↑pies, ↑stews, etc
 - **braising/stewing steak**
 - a steak and kidney pie
 4. **countable** a large thick piece of fish
 - a cod steak
