1. **intransitive** if two or more facts, figures, etc. correlate or if a fact, figure, etc. correlates with another, the facts are closely connected and affect or depend on each other
 - The figures do not seem to correlate.
 - ~ **with sth** A high-fat diet correlates with a greater risk of heart disease.
2. **transitive** ~ **sth** to show that there is a close connection between two or more facts, figures, etc
 - Researchers are trying to correlate the two sets of figures.
