[**demonic**] mid 17th cent.: via late Latin from Greek *daimonikos*, from *daimōn* ‘deity, genius’; also from Latin *daemonium* ‘lesser or evil spirit’.

Example Bank:

- This was a society in which demonic possession was greatly feared.
