I. **stereo** [stereo stereos] *BrE* ['steriəv] <sup>m</sup> *NAmE* ['steriəv] <sup>m</sup> **noun** (pl. **stereos**)  
 1. (also 'stereo system) **countable** a machine that plays CDs, etc, sometimes with a radio, that has two separate ↑speakers so that you hear different sounds from each  
 • a **car/personal stereo**  
 • Let's put some music on the stereo.  
 2. **uncountable** the system for playing recorded music, speech, etc. in which the sound is directed through two channels  
 • to broadcast **in stereo**  
**compare** ↑mono

 2. **in stereo** if sound is played or broadcast in stereo, it is directed through two speakers  
 ⇒ ↑personal stereo

 [Date: 1900-2000; Origin: stereophonic (1900-2000), from Greek stereos 'solid' + English phonic]  
 using a recording or broadcasting system in which the sound is directed through two ↑speakers ⇒ **mono**, **quadraphonic** :  
 stereo equipment
