the job of being president of a country or an organization; the period of time sb holds this job

- the current holder of the EU presidency
- She hopes to be the first woman elected to the presidency of the United States.
- He was a White House official during the Bush presidency.

Word Origin:

late 16th cent.: from medieval Latin *praesidentia*, from *praesidere* ‘sit before’, from *prae* ‘before’ + *sedere* ‘sit’.

Example Bank:

- He became a candidate for the vice presidency.
- She held the presidency of the association for three years.
- That year he resigned his presidency of the Academy.
- Three years into his presidency, he is more popular than ever.
- under the presidency of George W. Bush.
- under the presidency of Gerald Ford
