1. a child's toy in the shape of a person, especially a baby or a child
 - a rag doll (= one made out of cloth)
2. (*old-fashioned, informal, especially NAmE*) a word used to describe a pretty or attractive woman, now often considered offensive
 - She's quite a doll.

Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (denoting a mistress): pet form of the given name Dorothy. The sense 'small model of a human figure' dates from the late 17th cent.

1. **[countable]** a child's toy that looks like a small person or baby:
 a small wooden doll

2. [countable] *old-fashioned informal* a word meaning an attractive young woman – now usually considered offensive:

Hey, doll, why don't you get me a cup of coffee?

3. [singular] *American English informal* a very nice person:

Thanks, you're a doll.
