1. **countable, uncountable** time that is spent practising a play or piece of music in preparation for a public performance
  - to **have a rehearsal**
  - We only had six days of rehearsal.
  - Our new production of 'Hamlet' is currently **in rehearsal** .
  - a rehearsal room
  - The leading man broke his leg in the middle of rehearsals.

2. **countable, usually singular ~ (for sth)** an experience or event that helps to prepare you for sth that is going to happen in the future
  - These training exercises are designed to be a rehearsal for the invasion.
  - Life is not a rehearsal.
3. **countable, usually singular ~ of sth (formal)** the act of repeating sth that has been said before
  - We listened to his lengthy rehearsal of the arguments.

- I attended my friend's wedding rehearsal.
- I'll see you at band rehearsal on Monday!
- The wedding rehearsal dinner is tonight.
- They're performing every night and they have another production in rehearsal.

- a dress rehearsal for a Broadway play
- a rehearsal of the final scene
- rehearsals for 'Romeo and Juliet'
- Our new production of 'Hamlet' is currently in rehearsal.

2. **[countable]** a time when all the people involved in a big event practise it together before it happens:
  - a wedding rehearsal
