- · a mutant strain of the virus

- 1. (biology) a living thing with qualities that are different from its parents' qualities because of a change in its †genetic structure
- 2. (informal) (in stories about space, the future, etc.) a living thing with an unusual and frightening appearance because of a change in its <sup>†</sup>genetic structure
