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**THESAURUS**

- **dentist** someone whose job is to treat people's teeth: I've made an appointment with the dentist. | She always dreaded a visit to the dentist.
- **oral surgeon** a dentist who has special training to operate on people's teeth
- **orthodontist** a dentist who makes teeth straight when they have not been growing correctly
- **dental hygienist/hygienist** someone who is specially trained to help a dentist by cleaning teeth and giving advice about how to keep teeth healthy: Ask your dental hygienist for advice on using floss.
- **dental practitioner** *formal* a dentist
