Word Origin:

Middle English: from Old French *tresorier*, from *tresor*, based on Greek *thēsauros* ‘storehouse, treasure’; influenced by late Latin *thesaurarius*.

Example Bank:

- He agreed to act as treasurer.
- The treasurer's report gives a breakdown of the club's income and expenditure.
- the honorary treasurer of the rugby club
