1. **be at/in/to the forefront (of something)** to be in a leading position in an important activity that is trying to achieve something or develop new ideas:

- The company has always been at the forefront of science and technology.
- Prison conditions have been pushed to the forefront of public debate.

2. **be in/at/to the forefront of sb's mind/attention etc** to be what someone is thinking about most, because it is very important to them ⇒ **at the back of sb's mind:**

- Fear of unemployment was at the forefront of everyone's minds.
