• **just** especially spoken a very short time ago, especially only a few minutes, hours, days, or weeks ago: John's just gone out. | They've just had a new baby.

• a short/little while ago especially spoken not long ago – often used when you are not sure exactly when: That house was sold a short while ago. I looked in on her a little while ago and she was fast asleep.

• the other day *spoken* recently, especially only a few days ago: I met Lucy in town the other day. | You'll neverguess what happened to me the other day.

freshly made, prepared, done etc not long ago – used especially about food and drink. Also used about things that have just been painted, washed, or dug: freshly baked bread | freshly squeezed orange juice | The boat had been freshly painted.
