a situation in which a group of people join together in order to fight against the people who are in power

Syn: ↑rebellion, **Syn:** ↑revolt

- an armed uprising against the government
- a **popular uprising** (= by the ordinary people of the country)
- to **crush/suppress an uprising**

Example Bank:

- He was killed in the Soweto uprising.
- an uprising led by a rebel cleric
- the 1951 uprising against colonial rule
- the failed uprising of 1830
- He led an armed uprising against the government
- He used his troops to crush a popular uprising in the north.
- the 1956/Hungarian uprising

THESAURUS

- **revolt/rebellion /uprising** an attempt by a large group of people at revolution: a popular uprising (=involving ordinary people, not the army)
- **coup** /kuː/ an occasion when a group of people, especially soldiers, suddenly take control of a country: a military coup
