Word Origin:

mid 18th cent. (in the sense ‘extravagance in language or behaviour’): from Italian **estravaganza** ‘extravagance’. The change was due to association with words beginning with [↑]**extra-**.

Example Bank:

- The festival was to be a five-day extravaganza of art, music and dance.
- The parade was a real spectacle/extravaganza
