I. re-join 1 [rejoin rejoins rejoined rejoining] *BrE* [ˌrɪˈdʒɔɪn] *n* *NAmE*

[ˌrɪˈdʒɔɪn] *n* **verb transitive, intransitive** ~ (sb/sth)

to join sb/sth again after leaving them

- to rejoin a club
- She turned off her phone and rejoined them at the table.
- The path goes through a wood before rejoining the main road.

Word Origin:

late Middle English (in the sense 'reply to a charge in a lawsuit'): from Old French *rejoindre*, from *re-* 'again' + *joindre* 'to join'.

I. re-join 1 /rɪˈdʒɔɪn/ *BrE* *AmE* **verb [transitive]**

to go back to a group of people, organization etc that you were with before:

- She rejoined her friends in the lounge.
- In 1938 he rejoined the Socialists.

II. re-join 2 /rɪ'dʒɔɪn/ *BrE* *AmE* **verb [transitive] literary**

to say something in reply, especially rudely or angrily **SYN** retort:

- 'I don't care!' she rejoined.
