Word Origin:

late Middle English: from Latin *cataracta* 'waterfall, floodgate', also 'portcullis' (medical sense 1 probably being a figurative use of this), from Greek *kataraktēs* 'down-rushing', from *katarassein*, from *kata-* 'down' + *arassein* 'strike, smash'.
