Word Origin:mid 16th cent. (in the sense 'delude, baffle'): from Latin *eludere*, from *e-* (variant of *ex-*) 'out, away from' + *ludere* 'to play'.Example Bank:

- The point of the exercise seemed to elude the class.
- Winning this championship was a prize that had always eluded him.
- the higher levels of responsibility that have continued to elude women
- the success that has so far eluded her

**eˈluːd** /iˈluːd *BrE* *AmE* *verb* [transitive][Date: 1500-1600; Language: Latin; Origin: *eludere*, from *ludere* 'to play']1. to escape from someone or something, especially by tricking them **SYN** avoid:

" He eluded his pursuers by escaping into a river.

## 2. if something that you want eludes you, you fail to find or achieve it:

" She took the exam again, but again success eluded her.

3. if a fact or the answer to a problem eludes you, you cannot remember or solve it **SYN** escape:

" The exact terminology eludes me for the moment.
