- intransitive, transitive** to make an official decision about who is right in a disagreement between two groups or organizations
  - ~ **(on/upon/in sth)** A special subcommittee adjudicates on planning applications.
  - ~ **(sth) (between A and B)** Their purpose is to adjudicate disputes between employers and employees.
- intransitive** to be a judge in a competition
  - Who is adjudicating at this year's contest?

Word Origin:

early 18th cent. (in the sense 'award judicially'): from Latin **adjudicat-** 'awarded judicially', from the verb **adjudicare**, from **ad-** 'to' + **judicare**, from **judex**, **judic-** 'a judge'. The noun **adjudication** (as a Scots legal term) dates from the early 17th cent.

Example Bank:

- He has now been adjudicated bankrupt.
- Parliament can create a specialist body to adjudicate in a given field.
- The court has the option to adjudicate upon the matter or suspend the proceedings.

- [intransitive and transitive]** to officially decide who is right in a disagreement and decide what should be done:

The Dean adjudicates any faculty disputes.

**adjudicate on/upon/in/between**

The owner can appeal to the court to adjudicate on the matter.

**adjudicate that**

The judge adjudicated that he should be released.

- [intransitive]** to be the judge in a competition:

He adjudicated at all the regional music competitions.

**—adjudicator** *noun* [countable]:

an impartial adjudicator
