 - The samples were incubated at 80°C for three minutes.
3. **transitive** **be incubating sth (medical)** to have an infectious disease developing inside you before **symptoms** (= signs of illness) appear
 - The source of infection may be a person who is incubating an infectious disease.
4. **intransitive (medical) (of a disease)** to develop slowly without showing any signs
