Word Origin:early 19th cent.: from French **débâcle**, from **débâcler** ‘unleash’, from **dé-** ‘un-’ + **bâcler** ‘to bar’ (from Latin **baculum** ‘staff’).Example Bank:

- Let's hope this is the end of the debacle over player transfer fees.
