- **make an assessment** I had to make a quick assessment of the situation and act accordingly.
- **do/carry out an assessment** A teacher does a yearly assessment of each child's progress.

■ **adjectives**

- **a general/overall/broad assessment** (=that covers the main features or parts of something, not the details) The doctor must carry out a general assessment of the patient's health.
- **a detailed assessment** We need a detailed assessment of what this will cost.
- **a comprehensive assessment** (=that includes all the necessary facts or details) Our clients receive a comprehensive assessment of their financial affairs.
- **an objective assessment** (=that is based on facts, not on feelings or beliefs) The test results will provide an objective assessment of how much you have improved.
- **sb's personal assessment** What's your personal assessment of the risks?
