2. ~ **sb/sth (to sth)** to make sb/sth come somewhere or take part in sth

- The warm damp air attracts a lot of mosquitoes.
- The exhibition has attracted thousands of visitors.

3. ~ **sth** to make people have a particular reaction

- This proposal has **attracted a lot of interest**.
- His comments were bound to **attract criticism**.
- She tried to **attract the attention** of the waiter.

**attract attention/interest etc**

" The story has attracted a lot of interest from the media.

2. **be attracted to somebody** to feel that you like someone and want to have a sexual relationship with them:

" I'm not usually attracted to blondes.

3. to make someone like or admire something or feel romantically interested in someone:

" I guess it was his eyes that attracted me first.

4. to make someone or something move towards another thing:

" Leftover food attracts flies.

" low rents designed to attract new businesses to the area
