Which Word?:**partly / partially**Partly and partially both mean 'not completely': ▪ The road is partly/partially finished. Partly is especially used to talk about the reason for something, often followed by **because** or **due to**: ▪ I didn't enjoy the trip very much, partly because of the weather.

Partially should be used when you are talking about physical conditions: ▪ His mother is partially blind.

Example Bank:

- Inflation accelerated partly as a result of increased oil prices.
- It is partly a matter of personalities, but only partly.
- It was partly my fault.
- Prosperity increased partly as a consequence of reduced inflation.
- The measure was popular, partly because it was a way of avoiding tax.
- The result is partly a matter of skill and partly of chance.
