1. *преим. с отрицанием* обязательно, непременно  
that is not necessarily so - это необязательно так  
tall men are not necessarily strong men - высокий рост не всегда свидетельствует о силе
2. неизбежно  
it must necessarily follow that ... - из этого неизбежно следует, что ...  
◇ to be necessarily absent - *парл.* отсутствовать по уважительным причинам

1. **not necessarily** possibly, but not certainly:

▪ That is not necessarily true.

▪ Expensive restaurants aren't necessarily the best.

▪ Having this disease does not necessarily mean that you will die young.

▪ 'So the school will have to close down, then?' 'Not necessarily.'

2. *formal* in a way that cannot be different or be avoided **SYN inevitably** :

▪ The care of old people necessarily involves quite a lot of heavy lifting.
