- (of people or groups) in agreement and working together
 - We need to become a more united team.
 - They are united in their opposition to the plan.
 - We should present **a united front** (= an appearance of being in agreement with each other) .
- used in the names of some teams and companies
 - Manchester United
 - United Distillers

- a politically united federation
