In formal or literary writing, **rarely** can be put first, followed by an auxiliary and the subject, to emphasize that something does not often happen:

Rarely is the customer consulted on the changes.

## THESAURUS

• rarely not often: These geese are rarely found on inland waters. | 50% of Britons say they rarely eat meat.

• not (very) often often used in everyday English instead of saying rarely: Tina's not often late. | I don't go there very often. | It's not often that you get a chance like this.

• seldom rarely. Seldom is more formal than rarely and is used especially in written English: He seldom slept well. | They seldom went out.

• hardly ever/scarcely ever almost never: Ben's nineteen and he's hardly ever at home these days. | For some reason, her name was scarcely ever mentioned.

• very occasionally used when you want to emphasize that something only happens a few times over a long period of time: Very occasionally the temperature drops to below 30.
