▶ Do not confuse with **comprehensible** (=able to be understood) or **understanding** (=sympathetic about people's problems): *His report was barely comprehensible. | My parents are very understanding.*

3. **comprehensive education/system** a system of education in Britain in which children of different abilities go to the same school and are taught together

- No system has failed as comprehensively as the prison system.

—**comprehensiveness** **noun** [uncountable]
