■ ADJECTIVES/NOUN + departure

- **sudden/abrupt** (=done suddenly, without being planned) I didn't know how I was going to explain his abrupt departure to the others. | Their departure seemed rather sudden.
- **a hasty/speedy departure** (=done very quickly and suddenly) I was surprised by her hasty departure.
- **a flight/train/coach departure** I 'rafraid your flight departure has been delayed.

■ verbs

- **delay somebody's departure** (=make it later) I decided to delay my departure by a few days.

■ departure + NOUN

- **a departure date** (also **date of departure**) You cannot make a change to your booking within six weeks of your departure date.
- **a departure time** Do you know your exact departure time?
- **a departure point** (=the place where you leave from) Luxor is one departure point for boat trips down the Nile.
- **a departure gate** (=an exit from an airport to get a particular flight) I was a long walk with all our luggage to the departure gate.
- **a departure lounge** (=a room at an airport where people wait before their flights leave)
- **the departures board** (=a board showing the times of planes or trains) I scanned the departures board for details of my flight.
