The British Commonwealth of Nations was set up in 1931 and has been known simply as the Commonwealth since 1949. Members of the Commonwealth have special links with the UK and with each other and agree to work together towards world peace, the encouragement of trade, the defence of democracy and improvements in human rights, health and education. It also encourages joint cultural and sporting events, particularly the †Commonwealth Games. The British king or queen is the head of the Commonwealth and the senior official is the Secretary-General . A meeting of heads of government of all Commonwealth countries called the Commonwealth Conference takes place every two years and is organized by the Commonwealth Secretariat which is based in London. The second Monday in March is celebrated in many member countries as <sup>↑</sup>Commonwealth Day.
