- partly; not completely
- The road was partially blocked by a fallen tree.
 - a society for the blind and **partially sighted** (= people who can see very little) .
 - It's only partially true.

Which Word?:

partly / partially

Partly and partially both mean 'not completely': ▪ The road is partly/partially finished. Partly is especially used to talk about the reason for something, often followed by **because** or **due to**: ▪ I didn't enjoy the trip very much, partly because of the weather. Partially should be used when you are talking about physical conditions: ▪ His mother is partially blind.

Example Bank:

- It's a partially enclosed bay where fresh and salt water mix.
- Machines replaced, at least partially, the skills of human workers.
- Many of the images are partially hidden by captions.
- She teaches blind and partially sighted children.
- The accident left her partially blind/deaf/disabled.
- The plan was only partially successful.
- The road is partly/partially finished.
- The statement is only partially true.
- This trend was partially because of increased efficiency.
- When partially cooked, pasta has a slightly transparent look.
