invoice • (rather formal) a bill for goods that sb has bought or work that has been done for sb: • The builders sent an invoice for £250.

bill or invoice?

You would get a **bill** in a restaurant, bar or hotel; from a company that supplies you with gas, electricity, etc; or from sb whose property you have damaged. An **invoice** is for goods supplied or work done as agreed between a customer and supplier. **check** • (*NAmE*) a piece of paper that shows how much you have to pay for the food and drinks that you have had in a restaurant:

• Can I have the check, please?

In British English the usual word for this is **bill**.
