- (especially NAmE) a rental car
- a minimum rental period of three months

- 'Is this your own car?' 'No, it's a rental.'

Word Origin:

late Middle English: from Anglo-Norman French, or from Anglo-Latin *rentale*, from Old French *rente*, from a root shared by ↑render.

- a coupon for a free movie rental
- the broadband package includes 6 months free line rental
- The weekly rental on the car was over £200.

2. [uncountable and countable] an arrangement to rent something for a period of time, or the act of doing this rental contract/scheme/service etc

- Could you sign the rental agreement?
